We aim to actively promote British values in school to ensure young people leave school prepared for life in modern Britain. At NKS these values are reinforced regularly and are incorporated into our daily life together. We are proud to have children from all over the world attend our school and we treat people of all faiths, races and cultures with respect and tolerance. We also teach that while different people may hold different views about what is 'right' and 'wrong', all people living in England are subject to its law.
